I have a knitting pattern you could share or, make up your own. You could cut up any old material scraps to do this. The children could get involved as they are very inventive.

There is no colour scheme you can use any wool or material you have. I have used 4mm/ size 8 needles but any you have will do.

Bunting Pattern

DK wool, Size 5mm needles

Cast on 30 sts

Row 1. Knit

Row 2. K2tog, yo rep. to last 2sts, k2tog

Row 3. Knit

Row 4. K1, K2tog, K to last 3sts, K2tog K1

Row 5. Knit

Row 6. Knit

Rep Rows 3-6 until there are 5 sts left

Next row wrong side Knit

Next Row K, sl 2tog, K1, pssoK1

Next Row Knit

Next Row S12tog, K 1 psso

Fasten off and weave in ends.

The bunting can be threaded with ribbon or a crochet chain through the eyelets.
